Dachshunds have an average lifespan longer than up to 16 years, but it is important to avoid overeating your doxie. This very muscular and active dog is one of the oldest breeds in Bavaria and has longevity to match—they usually live for 12 to 14 years. Mixed breed dogs are not usually crossed or registered, but they can inherit their traits — good and bad — from parents of their different breeds. Because mixed breed dogs have a very wide gene pool (unlike breed dogs), it is less common for them to experience hereditary or genetic disorders. However, like all breeds, mixed breed dogs can develop conditions such as dog obesity, heart disease, and diabetes. They first appeared in ancient Egypt; then moved to Africa where they were employed as hunting dogs; and finally, to Europe and the United States, where they are kept as friends. On par with their long history, Basenjis has longevity — many live for 13 to 14 years. Since Basenji is a sighthound, they will pursue whatever prey they see—making them vulnerable to injury or even death. It is important to keep your Basenji on a closed fence or play area while exercising with it.
